Minutes of the Club Meeting

August 17, 2005

An interesting **program** on collecting and show trips to Quartzite, Arizona was presented by Ed Reynolds. Several of his finds were described and shown. The meeting was called to order at 8 o'clock by President Larry Barrick after the break.

Awards were presented to those who had helped at the Lucas County Fair. Andy Leslie, Tonia Pochay, Diane Klich, Chet King, David and Susan Farnham and family, Harold and Carla Burleson, Dick and Arlene Bowers and Don Ault received awards.

Minutes were approved as printed. The next Rocky Reader will come out the end of September.

Treasurer's report was presented, and approved as presented.

We never have received a bill for the Craft Center lease. It was recommended to go ahead and pay it, as we could be canceled out if it is not paid. Pete has a meeting with the Garden's director and city representative, and can pay it.

Open House is the first weekend in November, and table reservations are needed.

Show: Volunteers are needed for Thursday to load the truck. Sign up sheet was routed for volunteers for the show activities. Tear down on Sunday will need helpers. Volunteers can come to the show and will be given assignments. Changes include notification by Stranahan that we are not allowed to use the big cafeteria for food. We can use the small room, and still need food donations to feed the dealers on Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday. We can not sell prepackaged food this year. The Stranahan will have their own food catered in the cafeteria for the public, starting at 2 pm on Friday, but dealers and volunteer workers will still be able to eat Club donated food. We still need food volunteers. There will not be any storage, so food will need to be eaten that day. Coolers will be necessary from members. The banner is up at Franklin Park. Brochures need to be distributed by members to libraries, schools, and store bulletin boards. Raffle donations, silent auction donations and Rocky Roulette donations are needed. Much material is being stored in member's private homes. Thursday, before the show, will need landscape rocks and plants. Save plastic or paper grocery bags for silent auction purchases. Jerri Heer made complementary tickets that will be mailed to recipients upon request to her or Carla. Comps will be billed to the person requesting. Comps are good public relations gestures for teachers, quarry personnel, personal friends. We are almost filled with dealer spots. Mike Meyers is doing kid's kits. Deb has completed advertising. Raffle donations are still needed, and should be given to Linda Scherer.

Faceteers are still meeting at their regular times.

Arts in the Gardens was successful. Gem trees, beads, had several participants.

Heralding the Holidays: Deb is the Chairman for the Event. Sales tables request need to be made to Deb or Chet before the weekend.

Taste of Diversity: National Race Equality Day will have Ethnic foods on September 18, and need volunteers to tour the gardens and have asked for the

Craft Center to be open. However this is also Fossil Fest weekend, and several people will be working in Sylvania. The center can be opened if someone can man the center for the day. If anyone can work in the center, they should contact Chet.

Gem Crafters: A Time limit of 45 minutes has been set on the big saw, as many people want to use the saw. The wrong wheels are being used for grinding and are wearing out the fine grit polishing wheels. The rough grinding needs to be done on the coarse grit wheels, and only finish polishing on the fine grit wheels. During the show, equipment will be available for demonstrating. Sphere making will be available. A request was made for gemcrafters to continue to clean up after themselves. Recent cleaning of the center had water and sludge sitting in all the drip pans and mosquito larvae were found in the pans. Users are asked to consider workers following themselves, so they don't have to clean up after them as well as themselves, and to avoid contributing to development of insect pests in the center. Users need to wipe out the pans and the surrounding area when finished with a machine

Sunshine: Jim Jarecki had cataracts removed from his eyes.

Membership: 45 members here; One new member. Dues are due in September.

Metal crafter meetings are in the calendar. Only two meetings in September due to the show and Fossil Fest.

Participants in the solder-free Sterling Silver Byzantine Bracelet class to be taught on November 5, by Kathy Petersen, need to get their fee (\$40) to Kathy to hold their place in class.

Minutes of the Board Meeting

September 21, 2005

Building Repairs: Larry received a letter from the City of Toledo, Barbara Herring, Director of Law, to convey concerns relative to the craft center repairs. The city agrees to: exterminate the building to eradicate carpenter ants, place dehumidifiers in the building to dry out the premises, repair damaged areas on the walls, repair damaged areas on the ceiling, completely paint the building interior with enamel paint, check for and properly treat any rust on electrical panels and boxes and repair ceilings walls in herb society.

Relative to lifetime membership: Discussion related to what qualifies as a lifetime member, or lifetime achievement award. Current people given award have continued to be active. Two current recipients: Frank McCreary and Chet King. George Pochay was a recipient.

President's Award is a yearly award for current year's contributions.

Lifetime Achievement is an honorary award, not automatic for years of membership. There has never been a set criterium, or mandatory statute for the award. There were a few life members in years past. The president has the authority to make the award based on the approval of the board. The award is optional, and the president may nominate a member for consideration by the board. The most that can be awarded is one per year.

Prior lifetime members have continued to pay dues, even with lifetime achievement. Membership dues will not be affected by the achievement award. The board voted unanimously to accept this criterium and definition.

Show discussion: Relative to the raffle, costs are subtracted from the proceeds prior to awarding the scholarship amounts. University scholarships to be awarded at the October meeting. Discussion related to the caterer and food provided to the vendors. Gate fees were down this year, as were all proceeds from show activities.

CLASSES

The following schedule is a listing of upcoming classes. To enroll, please **send the instructional fee to the instructor**. Fees must be received, at the latest, **one week prior to the class**. Refunds will be issued only if cancellations are received seven days prior to the class.

October 15 10AM. Enameled Bead - Instructor: Harriet Neering. Fee \$40.00. This class, taught by Toledo Museum of Art Enameling Instructor, Harriet Neering, will introduce students to enameling on a three dimensional object - a large copper bead. Students will learn to use liquid enamels, to fire in a kiln and to use foil overlays. This class is introductory and students of all ages and abilities are welcome

November 5 10AM. Byzantine bracelet. Instructor: Kathy Petersen. Fee \$40.00. In this class, Kathy will teach us to make a heavy sterling silver bracelet in the Byzantine style (also called Idiot's delight). This class does not require any soldering skills and is open to beginners. Participants need to bring two needlenose, flat (no teeth) pliers. One or both should be the rounded kind, but both don't have to be, you just need to have two pliers.

January 21, 2006, 10AM. Argentium™ Silver workshop. Instructor: Debra Hoffmaster. Fee \$40.00. In this workshop, students will have an opportunity to fuse, solder, anneal, forge and polish this new firescale-free, tarnish resistant, germanium alloy. The suitability of the alloy for Keum-boo, reticulation and other techniques will be discussed. Students should have a good grasp of basic metalsmithing techniques.
